The demonstration system comes with two/three receivers and an assortment of ear pieces, including a neck-loop for those who have “t-coils” in their hearing aids!

SIMULTANEOUS INTERPRETATION SYSTEMS

With many churches having bi-lingual services, we have found a need for a translator to listen to the service which may be in Spanish and translate the words to English, Chinese, or Lithuanian for example.

Those wanting to hear the service in a different language, will use a small receiver tuned to the “interpretation channel,” with earpieces such as headphones, ear-buds, or neck-loop coils.
